# About the Birthing Suites


Birthing Beds: These highly functional beds convert to different positions in order to make your delivery as comfortable as possible.

# Before the Big Day

With so many things to do before your baby is born, it's nice to be able to cross a few of them off your list as soon as possible. That's why we recommend you take the time to pre-register by your 7th month, and pack your bag (just in case!) at least three weeks before your due date.

Included in this guide is a detachable checklist you and your birth partner can use for help as you pack your bag and prepare for the exciting day!

#### Pre-Admitting is Fast and Easy

When it is time to make your way to the hospital, you will want to know that WHMC is ready for your arrival. How? By pre-registering for your admission. You may complete the detachable preregistration application and return it to WHMC at your convenience.

By making your hospital arrangements in advance, you can have peace of mind knowing that everything will be ready for you when you arrive.

#### **Billing Information**

If you have hospitalization insurance, we will bill your insurance company for you. If you do not have insurance, we can assist you by referring you to our Financial Counselor.

Our professional staff will meet with you to assist in securing health benefits for yourself and your growing family.

We also have cash packages available. Our Health Benefits Representatives can meet with you to see which financial option is best suited to meet your needs.

#### **Arrival Instructions**

When you arrive for delivery, please go to the main lobby of the hospital or you can go to the Emergency Room entrance 24/7.

## **Special Delivery**

With your physician's agreement, your labor partner and designated family members are welcome to be with you during the delivery.

Children are not allowed in labor rooms.

#### **Enjoying Your Visitors**

We welcome visitors so family members and friends can visit you and your new baby.

Our primary concern is that moms are given time to recover before they return home. Moms may have visitors 24 hours a day unless otherwise specified.

We practice "Quiet Time" from 2:00pm - 4:00pm. During this time, we encourage peaceful rest in a quiet environment with limited interruptions. We strongly encourage you to take advantage of this time and let your visitors know about this special private time. Fathers are allowed during Quiet Time.

### **Labor and Delivery Visitor Guidelines**

Support persons are allowed during labor, two at a time. Children are not allowed in labor rooms. Visitor badges are required.

Visitors are limited to two at a time and limited to one hour. Siblings are welcome to visit and they must be accompanied by an adult.

Visitors who have had any of the following symptoms in the past two weeks may not visit:

- Fever
- Running nose, cold, or any respiratory infection
- Cough
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Rash
- Draining sores
- Sore throat
- Draining eye
- Exposure to a contagious disease such as measles, chicken pox, mumps, hepatitis, and rubella



### Safety First

For you and your baby's safety, we ask that you adhere to the following:

- We advise that baby sleep on his or her back, not on his or her side, unless sleeping in mom or dad's arms.
- When leaving the hospital, hospital personnel must accompany mother and baby by wheelchair to the car.

# **Infant Security**

Protection starts right in the delivery room. The system continually monitors the location of the device placed on mother and baby. It will generate an alarm if triggered.

#### Photography

It is the goal of Whittier Hospital Medical Center to provide patients, their families, and visitors with a safe and secure environment. The use of any device for photography or audio and/or video recording or transmission is permitted only for capturing personal events. Any photography (still or video), recording or transmission of images, audio or video of other patients or the medical records of other patients, visitors, staff, physicians, and volunteers without their expressed prior consent is strictly prohibited.

#### **Active Labor and Pain Relief**

Like most mothers, you may wonder how long you will be in labor, how you will react to the discomfort of the contractions, or how easy the delivery will be. Every mother's childbirth experience is different; our team will be there to answer your questions and help you along the way.

Many types of medications and anesthesia are available to reduce the discomfort of childbirth. If you require pain medication to decrease your discomfort of childbirth, and help you relax, you will be evaluated by our pain management specialist, an anesthesiologist who is available 24 hours a day.

The type and amount of medication depends on several factors. These include the stage of labor you're in, the degree of pain relief needed, and the condition of you and your baby. If anesthesia is needed, you and your physician will decide what is best for you.

# **Analgesics**

Analgesics provide some pain relief without the total loss of feeling or alertness. They may lessen your discomfort during contractions, and you may even relax enough to sleep between contractions. These medications should have little effect on the baby.

#### **Epidural Anesthesia**

Epidural anesthesia may be used to numb your lower body during vaginal or cesarean birth.

Epidurals relax the abdominal muscles before and during the birth of your baby. After the baby is born, normal sensation soon returns. For more information on pain relief during childbirth, talk to your health care provider.

#### Non-Pharmacological/Natural Pain Relief Methods

Labor pain varies from one woman to another. For women who prefer to manage labor pain naturally without the use of medication, we offer natural pain relief methods to help ease the discomfort of labor.

We also offer prepared childbirth education classes to help support and teach women how to manage their pain by using these techniques.





# **Breastfeeding Instructions**

There is a great deal to learn about breastfeeding in order to make it a pleasant and successful experience for you and your baby. At the Maternity Center, our nursing staff will be available to offer you and your baby personalized assistance to meet your needs.
